# Available resources

Resources include two PCs with an attached scanner and optical magnifying equipment. Software includes:

- Screen reading software.
- ZoomText—enlarges text on the PC screen and provides a text reader.
- Kurzweil 3000—includes a text-to-speech converter and features to assist with reading, writing, and study skills (see below).

The scanner can be used to scan text for import into text reading software.

### Access to assistive technology in the library

- The equipment is located on the second of the Emerson Library on the second floor of the Webster University campus. The area is a nook labeled "ADA 202" on the south side of the second floor.
- Use is on a first come, first served basis.
- Kurzweil 3000 software requires a login. A guest login can be obtained from at the service desk located near the entrance to the second-floor.
