
## Organizing for Peace in the Time of War

# Rev. Dr. Damyathi Niles

Organizing for Peace in a Time of War

A professor of Constructive Theology, with a focus on peace studies, Rev. Dr. Niles has been a part of the Eden faculty since 2000. Dr. Niles brings to her classes a unique perspective as a "true citizen of the world." Having lived, worked, and studied in several countries, she can offer international insights and interpretations on theological issues.

She has been a member of the General Assembly Committee on Ecumenical Relations (GACER) of the Presbyterian Church USA since 2006 and was Chair of the subcommittee on Interfaith Relationships for GACER 2007-2012.

"I want my students to understand that the ministry is a creative process. They need to learn from others and apply what they learn to their own lives. I encourage them to ask themselves, 'what lessons can I learn from this person?' It's important to understand that the people that they can learn the most from are the other people they meet on their spiritual

journey."
